The Event Supports the Literary Arts and Creativity in the Community

MCKINNEY, Texas – November 10, 2023 – On October 15, the Mockingbird Poetry Society (MPS) kicked off its flagship event, The 53rd Collin County Poetry Contest (CCPC). The contest is open to poets of all ages living or attending school in Collin County, including homeschooled and private school students. CCPC contest submissions must be postmarked by February 1, 2024. Contest instructions and submission rules apply and are available on the MPS website.

MPS has sponsored the CCPC every year since the group's inception in 1970. Poets of any age can submit an original, unpublished poem for judging. Categories include every grade level K-12, college, adult and Mockingbird members. We encourage teachers of all grade levels to make the contest a class project.

The MPS prints an anthology each year containing first, second, third and honorable mention winners (if applicable in a category). Winners and their families are invited to attend an awards ceremony on April 14, 2024, where winning poets will read their poems and receive a free copy of a professionally printed anthology.
